



CHILD PROTECTION POLICY

Football can contribute to the physical, social, emotional and spiritual development of young people. However, this only applies if all the adults involved are positive role models and display high moral and ethical standards.

- Appoint a nominated contact for child protection (Child Welfare Officer).
- Ensure staff/volunteers are checked by:
 - completing a criminal record check.
 - Completing a personal disclosure form
 - Taking up references (two if possible – one on work with children one on involvement with sport)
- Ensure staff/volunteers complete The FA's Child Protection and best practice workshop.

The Club is committed to the development of the programme of ongoing training and awareness, events and activities to promote Child Protection within its own organisation and, in the wider context, within football as a whole.
